Subject: Request that the City Council consider adopting an ordinance amending City Code Chapter 17, "Traffic", Article III, "Speed Regulations", Section 17-64, establishing a new school speed zone speed limit of 20 mph for Jack Elementary School along Blue Mountain Boulevard, Rockpoint Circle, Balsam Gap, Grassy Ridge Lane, Neighbors Road, Rocky Mountain Lane, Manassas Lane and Spruce Pine Lane.

**REVIEW OF SPEED LIMIT ON BLUE MOUNTAIN BOULEVARD AND OTHER
STREETS**

Texas Transportation Code Section 545.356 and City Code Section 17-61 authorize the City Council to establish speed limits, on the basis of engineering and traffic studies and the recommendation of the Traffic Engineer.

Tyler City Code Section 17-64a. states that the Traffic Engineer shall designate school traffic zones with appropriate street markings or signs. These decreased speed limits for school zones shall be for hours designated on school days, where school signs are posted or at any time when electrical control devices are in operation advising motorists of the speed limit in the school zone. Tyler Independent School District is in the process of constructing a new campus for Jack Elementary School. At the school's request, the Traffic Engineering staff studied traffic flow on the city streets surrounding the campus and recommends establishing a new school speed zone with a speed limit of 20 mph on a portion of Blue Mountain Boulevard, Rock Point Circle, Balsam Gap, Grassy Ridge Lane, Neighbors Road, Rocky Mountain Lane, Manassas Lane and Spruce Pine Lane.

REVIEW BY TRAFFIC SAFETY BOARD

City Code Section 17-30.c. states that the Traffic Safety Board shall make recommendations through the Traffic Engineer regarding safety as it deems necessary. On June 21, 2007, the Traffic Safety Board had discussions regarding the proposed school zone speed limit and voted to recommend approval of this ordinance to the City Council.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council adopt an ordinance amending City Code Chapter 17, "Traffic", Article III, "Speed Regulations", Section 17-64, establishing a new school speed zone speed limit of 20 mph for Jack Elementary School along Blue Mountain Boulevard, Rockpoint Circle, Antioch Boulevard, Balsam Gap, Grassy Ridge Lane, Neighbors Road, Rocky Mountain Lane, Manassas Lane and Spruce Pine Lane.



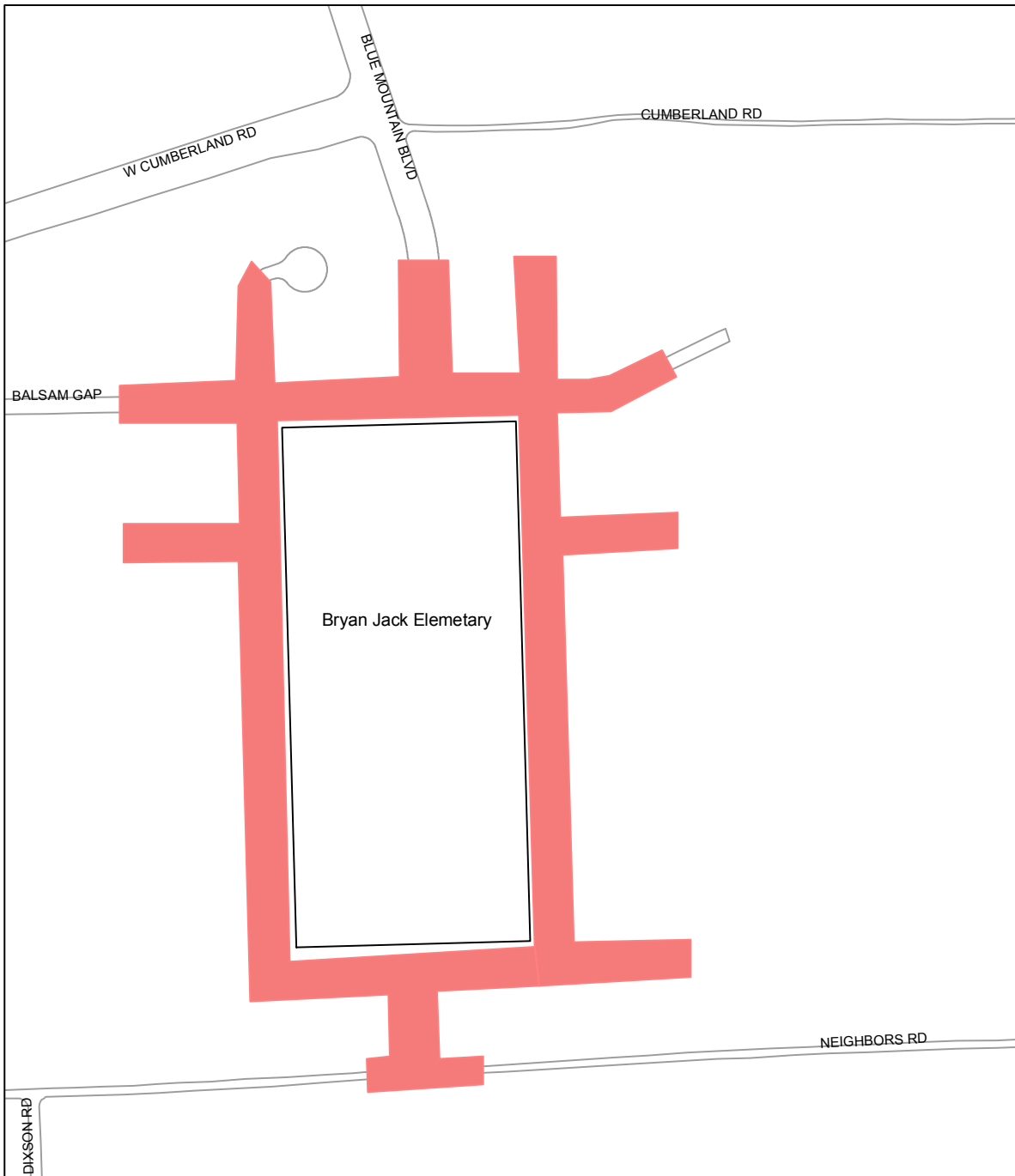

ORDINANCE NO. 0-2007-76

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS, AMENDING TYLER CITY CODE CHAPTER 17, "TRAFFIC", ARTICLE III., "SPEED REGULATIONS", BY ESTABLISHING THE LIMITS OF A SCHOOL SPEED ZONE FOR JACK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ON A PORTION OF BLUE MOUNTAIN BOULEVARD, ROCKPOINT CIRCLE, ANTIOCH BOULEVARD, BALSAM GAP, GRASSY RIDGE, NIEGHBORS ROAD, ROCKY MOUNTAIN LANE, ROCKPOINT LANE MANASSAS LANE AND SPRUCE PINE LANE; AND DIRECTING THE LOCATION OF APPROPRIATE SIGNAGE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; DECLARING A PENALTY; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Texas Transportation Code Section 545.356 provides that the governing body of a municipality, for a highway or part of highway in the municipality, has the authority to alter by ordinance prima facie speed limits from the results of an engineering and traffic investigation; and

WHEREAS, Texas Transportation Code Section 545.356 states that a prima facie speed limit that is altered by the governing body of a municipality is effective when the governing body erects signs giving notice of the new limit and at all times or at other times as determined; and

WHEREAS, Tyler City Code Section 17-61.a. provides that the Traffic Engineer shall determine on the basis of engineering and traffic surveys, the reasonable and safe maximum speed limits for each City street and submit recommendations based on such investigation to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Tyler City Code Section 17-61.b. provides that on the basis of recommendations of the Traffic Engineer, the City Council may alter speed limits deemed necessary; and

WHEREAS, Tyler City Code Section 17-64 establishes specific school speed zones; and

WHEREAS, Tyler City Code Section 17-62 provides that the Traffic Engineer shall post the maximum and minimum speed limits, if any, by appropriate signs in conspicuous places so that every motorist may be aware of the speed limits; and

WHEREAS, Tyler City Code Section 17-30.c. states that the Traffic Safety Board shall make recommendations through the Traffic Engineer regarding traffic safety as the Board deems necessary; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS:

PART 1: That Tyler City Code Chapter 17, “Traffic”, Article III., “Speed Regulations”, is hereby amended by amending the following school speed limit in Section 17-64 to read as follows:

Jack Elementary School	20	Blue Mountain Boulevard	From 270 feet north of north line of Balsam Gap to the south line of Balsam Gap <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Rockpoint Circle	From 270 feet north of north line of Balsam Gap to the south line of Balsam Gap <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Antioch Boulevard	From north line of Rocky Mountain Lane to the south line of Neighbors Road <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Balsam Gap	From 265 feet west of the west line of Rockpoint Lane to 270 feet east of the east line of Manassas Lane <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Grassy Ridge Lane	From 260 feet west of west line of Rockpoint Lane to east line of Rockpoint Lane <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Neighbors Road	From 70 feet west of west line of Antioch Blvd to 70 feet east of east line of Antioch Blvd <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Rocky Mountain Lane	From west line of Rockpoint Lane to 270 feet east of east line of Manassas Lane <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Rockpoint Lane	From the north line of Balsam Gap to the south line of Rocky Mountain Lane <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Manassas Lane	From 270 feet north of north line of Balsam Gap to the south line of Rocky Mountain Lane <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>
Jack Elementary School	20	Spruce Pine Lane	From west line of Manassas Lane to 260 feet east of east line of Manassas Lane <i>(Ord. 0-2007-76, 7/11/07)</i>

PART 2: That the Traffic Engineer is hereby directed to remove any existing signage that is no longer necessary and to post all appropriate new signage, as required by Tyler City Code Section 17-62, so that every motorist will be aware of the altered speed zone limits.

PART 3: That if any provision or any section of this ordinance shall be held to be void or unconstitutional, such holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions or sections of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

PART 4. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine as provided in Section 1-4 of the Tyler Code. Each day such violation shall continue, or be permitted to continue, shall be deemed a separate offense. Since this ordinance has a penalty for violation, it shall become effective upon its publication in the newspaper as provided by Section 85 of the Charter of the City of Tyler, Texas, which date is expected to be July 13, 2007.
