

RESOLUTION NO. R-2009-32

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS, RESOLVING TO SUPPORT THE GOALS AND IDEALS FOR THE 2010 CENSUS AND WILL DISSEMINATE 2010 CENSUS INFORMATION TO ENCOURAGE PARTICIPATION, ASK AFFILIATES AND MEMBERSHIP TO WORK TOGETHER TO ACHIEVE AN ACCURATE AND COMPLETE COUNT, AND TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN EVENTS AND INITIATIVES THAT WILL RAISE THE OVERALL AWARENESS OF THE 2010 CENSUS AND INCREASE PARTICIPATION AMONG ALL POPULATIONS AND ESTABLISH A COMPLETE COUNT COMMITTEE IN COOPERATION WITH ALL OTHER AGENCIES WITHIN SMITH COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Census Bureau is required by the U.S. Constitution to conduct a count of the population and provides a historic opportunity to help shape the foundation of our society and play an active role in American democracy; and

WHEREAS, our organization is committed to ensuring every resident is counted; and

WHEREAS, more than \$400 billion per year in federal and state funding is allocated to communities, and decisions are made on matters of national and local importance based, in part, on census data, including health care, community development, housing, education, transportation, social services, employment and much more; and

WHEREAS, census data help determine how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives and often is used for the redistricting of state legislature, county and city councils and voting districts; and

WHEREAS, the 2010 Census creates hundreds of thousands of jobs across the nation; and

WHEREAS, every Census Bureau worker takes a lifetime oath to protect confidentiality, and the Census Bureau ensures that the data identifying respondents or their household will not be released or shared for 72 years; and

WHEREAS, a united voice from business, government, community-based and faith-based organizations, educators, media and others will allow the 2010 Census message to reach a broader audience, providing trusted advocates who can spark positive conversations about the 2010 Census; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable that this Resolution be adopted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS:

PART 1. That the City Council Supports the goals and ideals for the 2010 Census and will disseminate 2010 Census information to encourage participation, asks its affiliates and


membership to work together to achieve an accurate and complete count, and encourages people in our community to participate in events and initiatives that will raise the overall awareness of the 2010 Census and increase participation among all populations.

PART 2. That the City Council establish a complete count committee and select the appropriate membership to coordinate with other agencies in Smith County, Texas and organize efforts in pursuit of these goals listed in Exhibit A.

PART 3. That the Mayor, the City Council members and the City Clerk and other officers of the City, or any of them, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver such certificates, instruments or other papers and to do all other things necessary or advisable to give effect to the intent and purpose hereof.

PART 4. That this Resolution shall be effective upon the date of passage by the City Council.

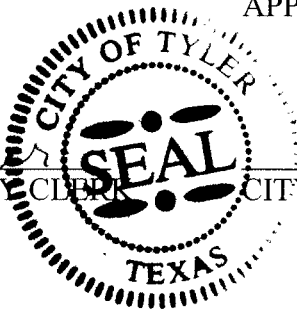
