


# RULE BOOK

## **PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES**

**Company:** Any vocational enterprise, either public or private, with paid employees is eligible to participate. It may include private companies, government agencies, educational or institutional units and non-profit corporations. Voluntary organizations such as civic clubs or associations are excluded.

### **INDIVIDUALS**

- 1) Must be a permanent, non-seasonal employee who has worked for the company at least 30 days prior to the event for at least 30 hours per week. Non-seasonal means the employee works more than six months in the year.
- 2) May compete for only one company.
- 3) Must assume all risks from medical disorders.
- 4) Significant others are eligible to participate as long as one spouse meets the eligibility requirements. No other family members are eligible.
- 5) Must be at least 16 years of age by March 21, 2020.
- 6) Verification documentation must be in each participant's possession during the competition (check stub, company badge, business card).
- 7) Protests on eligibility are upon request only. The protesting team may be responsible to pay a \$25 protest fee. If a team is found to be in violation of the eligibility rules, they will be disqualified from that particular event. If a team is found to be in violation of the eligibility rules a second time, they will be disqualified from all events.

# POINT SYSTEM

## **Individual Event Points:**

**All team rosters will be signed by the personnel director of the company or someone designated to act in the verification of employment eligibility.**

**If more than one team per company enters, the teams must be designated Team A, Team B, etc. The points accumulated by the company's different teams will be totaled for the overall championship separately. Participants may compete on only one team per event.**

**In the event of a tie in the championship standings, the tie will be broken in the following order:**

1. The teams with most points accumulated in the most events.
2. The team with the most 1st place finishes.
3. The team with the most 2nd place finishes.
4. The team with the most 3rd place finishes.
5. The team with the most 4th place finishes.
6. The team with the most 5th place finishes.
7. The team with the most 6th place finishes.

### **BASKETBALL CO-ED**

1. A five on five full-court format will be played.
2. A game shall consist of two 10 minute halves.
3. The clock will stop for time-outs and other reasons stated in the NCAA rules. A maximum of two timeouts per game, per team are allowed.
4. The basketball competition is co-ed.
5. Any individual having two technical fouls shall be ejected from the game. Any team having a total of three technical fouls shall forfeit the game.
6. A single elimination tournament will be offered.
7. Games will be at **Glass Recreation Center, 501 W. 32nd St., on April 15 and April 17.**
8. Game times are set between **6 p.m. and 9:30 p.m.**

### **CORN HOLE**

1. Each team will stay in their designated lane for the whole game.
2. Flip a coin to see who goes first.
3. Every player has 20 seconds to make a throw.
4. Players at the headboard will alternate pitching bags until each player has pitched all four of his/her bags.
5. Players at the foot board will take score and resume pitching back to the other board
6. The top of an inning is completed when both players pitching from the headboard pitch all four bags; the bottom of the inning is completed when the remaining players pitching from the foot board pitch all four bags.
7. The game shall be played to the predetermined number of twenty-one points. The first player/team to reach (or exceed) that amount at the conclusion of an inning is the winner.
8. Matches will be played at **Lindsey Park, 12557 Spur 364 W., on softball fields 1 on Saturday, April 18.**

#### Point System

Play until someone reaches or exceeds 21 points:

Bag goes in the hole = 3 points

Bag goes on the board = 1 point

Bag is hanging on the edge of the hole = 1 point

Bag goes off the board = 0 points

Bag is touching the ground but still on the board = 0 points

## DISC GOLF

1. Teams can have up to 4 players
2. SAFETY FIRST: Never throw when players or park users are within range. Always give park users the right of way. Be aware of your surroundings and environment.
3. Tee Throws: Each hole begins with a tee throw. Tee throws must be completed within or behind the designated tee area.
4. Lie: The lie is the spot where the player's previous throw has landed. Mark lie with a mini disc or turn over the thrown disc, directly towards the hole or designated fairway. The player's subsequent throw is made from directly behind the marked lie.  
Throwing Order: The player with the least amount of strokes on the previous hole is the first to tee off on the next hole. After teeing off, the player whose disc is farthest from the hole always throws first.
4. Fairway Throws: Fairway throws must be made from directly behind the lie. A run-up and normal follow-through, after release, is allowed, unless the lie is within 10 meters of the target. Any shot within 10 meters of the target requires that the player not move past the lie until the disc is at rest.
5. Dogleg (or Mandatory): A dogleg is one or more designated trees or poles in the fairway that must be passed as indicated by arrows. Until the dogleg is passed the closest foot to the dogleg must be on the lie when the disc is released.  
Completion of Hole: A disc that comes to rest in the disc golf basket, basket or chain constitutes successful completion of the hole.
6. Unplayable Lie: Any disc that comes to rest above the ground is considered an unplayable lie. The disc must be thrown from the lie on the ground, directly underneath the unplayable lie, relocated to avoid damage to the vegetation.
7. Out of Bounds: If any area of O.B. is visible between the disc and O.B. line, then the disc is considered O.B. A throw that lands out of bounds, must be played from a point 3 feet in bounds from where the disc went out of bounds. Permanent water hazards and public roads are always out of bounds.
8. Penalties: Recreational players will not be penalized for rule infractions. Other players will keep you honest.
9. Course Courtesy
  - A. Remain quiet and avoid unnecessary movements while others are throwing
  - B. Stand behind the player who is throwing until throw is complete.
  - C. Remove disc from Disc Pole Hole® after completing the hole.
  - D. Help new players learn the rules.
  - E. Allow faster groups to play through when possible.
  - F. Pick up trash and put in proper receptacles.
  - G. Do not alter the course (trees, bushes, etc.) in any way
10. Disc Golf will take place on **Monday, April 13 at 6 p.m., at Lindsey Park, 12557 Spur 364 W. at disc golf course.**

## DARTS

1. Teams can have up to 3 players.
2. Each team starts with 501 points. The purpose of the game is to decrease their score down to zero. There is a warm-up prior to the beginning of the game; nine throws are permitted for each player. Before the player can count points, a player should strike a double first.
3. The team who manages to get closest to the target or bull's eye gets to go first.
4. When a player needs to throw either a bull's eye or a double that will decrease the finishing score accurately to zero.
5. Two sets of darts will be thrown. Each player throws three darts. A throwing line is set. No points are counted for a throw if a player's foot lands over the throwing line.
6. Darts are to be left on the board to add player's final and finishing throw. If a dart joins into any dart on the board or falls off the board, it will not be counted for the score.
7. Scores are added according to the darts that stick to the board.
8. Darts will take place at **Twisted Root Burger Company, 4601 S Broadway Ave, starting at 6 p.m. on April 21.**

The score is tallied as follows:

Wedge - the number that is displayed.

Double ring - any number hit by the dart is scored two times.

The triple ring - any number hit by the dart scored three times.

Bulls eye - twenty-five points.

Double bulls-eye - fifty points.

## 5K RUN

1. Teams can have up to two participants of the same gender. Individuals can run as their own team. The best time of the two runners will be taken out of the two. Participants may choose to run without a teammate.
2. All runners will start at the same time and run the same course as marked.
3. Runners will not cut corners or deviate from designated course; violators will be disqualified.
4. Overall winners will be determined according to the lowest times.
5. Water and first aid will be provided at the start/finish line.
6. Scoring will consist of adding the times of the two runners per team.
7. All runners will meet at **Rose Rudman, 450 Shiloh Rd, starting line at 9 a.m. Saturday, April 25.** Instructions will be given prior to the start of the race on the exact route of the run. The 5K map will be posted on the event website, [tylrcorporatechallenge.com](http://tylrcorporatechallenge.com).

## DOMINOS

1. Each team will consist of two players.
2. Time limit on matches is 45 minutes.
3. First to go down is the player that draws double six.
4. When a game is blocked, the team with the lowest point total wins the hand.
5. Scores must be orally called before the next person plays.
6. Overdrawing is a 50 point penalty if all the dominoes are viewed.
7. Passed and could play is a 50 point penalty. The game stops and the down is given to the opposing team
8. No communication between partners
9. Dominoes will take place at the **Senior Center, 1915 Garden Valley Rd, Tuesday, April 16 at 6pm.**



## **DODGEBALL**

1. A team consists of three male and three female players.
2. Court size will be 60' x 30' or a standard volleyball court.
3. Each match is played as the best of three games and each game has a time limit of eight minutes. Overtime has a time limit of three minutes per period.
4. If, at a scheduled match time, one team fails to field a team of at least five players, that team shall forfeit the match to the other team.
5. The balls will be placed at center court. Players must start behind their own baseline before the start of play.
6. A floating off-sides line will be used. The center line is the first boundary line. When throwing the ball, a player must not have either foot completely across the line when throwing. After the ball has been released, it is permitted for a player's momentum to carry them over the boundary line, so long as they immediately return to their side of the court and do not attempt to pick up a Dodgeball while on the other side of the boundary.
7. Once either team has two or fewer players, team may advance to the opposing team's blue line.
8. Players will be called out if a thrown ball hits them. The ball must hit a player below the shoulders to be considered out. If a player ducks or is on the ground and is hit in the head, the player hit will be called out.
9. Players will be called out if a ball they throw is caught on the fly. If a ball is deflected off of a player and caught by a teammate, the thrower is out.
10. Deflections off the floor, wall, court dividers, rafters, bleachers, hoop and officials do not count as an out if caught. Deflections off a teammate do count, and both players are out. If a ball hits you and then hits the wall, bleachers or curtain and you catch it you are still out.
11. If a ball hits another ball, which a player has in their possession, it does not make either player out. If the ball is dropped as a result of contact from the thrown ball, then the player who drops the ball is out.
12. All players are confined to the field of play. Players may intentionally leave the playing area on their own side of the playing floor to retrieve a ball. If a player goes out of bounds to avoid getting out, the player will be called out. If a ball is thrown into the bleachers, it must be given to the team that is on that side.
13. If a player is stalling, or making no attempt to play a ball, they must roll the ball to the other side. A player may be called out at the official or supervisor's discretion for continuously stalling to avoid an outcome of the game.
14. Once a player is out, they must immediately leave the floor and sit on the sideline behind their own baseline. Players who have been called out can retrieve stray balls for their teammates as long as the ball is on their side and they do not step on the field of play.
15. All decisions by officials are final; **ARGUING DECISIONS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.** Players arguing after a warning will be penalized by disqualification from the remainder of a game or match, or ejected from the game. The supervisor will rule on any situation not specifically covered in the rules.
16. Games will be played at the **Glass Recreation Center, 501 W. 32nd St. Friday, April 24 at 6:00 p.m.**

## **HORSESHOES**

1. A single elimination tournament will be offered in doubles with any combination of males and/or females making up the team.
2. One match to 21 will determine the winner, with a winning margin of at least two points.
3. Point Values:
  - a. Ringer-three points
  - b. Leaner-one point
  - c. Closest to the pole-one point (must be within 12 inches to score).
  - d. Horseshoes will be provided by Tyler Parks and Recreation Department.
4. Men will “pitch” from 40 feet. Women will have the option to “pitch” from 35 to 40 ft.
5. Matches will be played at **Lindsey Park, 12557 Spur 364 W. on softball fields 1 on Saturday, April 18.**

## **KICKBALL**

1. Teams will consist of six men and four women on a field. Teams may start with eight players, but three must be women. A maximum of six men on the playing field.
2. All games will be played with a rubber kickball.
3. Each team gets three outs per inning. A kicker is out if three strikes are thrown, or if a ball is kicked foul on the third strike. A kicker is out when the fielding team touches a base with a ball before the kicker arrives, or if he is hit with a thrown ball below the shoulders while running the bases. A kicked ball caught by a fielder before hitting the ground will also result in an out.
4. The pitcher delivers the ball, and must do so with one foot in contact with the pitching rubber. The ball must be rolling or have bounced twice before reaching home plate to be counted as a fair pitch. If the ball passes through the strike zone and the kicker does not make contact, it counts as a strike. A ball that goes wide of the strike zone, is not rolling or did not bounce twice will count as a ball.
5. Each game is 45 minutes. Once the match has met the 45 minute mark, teams will finish the inning they are in and the match will conclude.
6. A single elimination tournament will be offered.
7. Games will be played at **Lindsey Park, 12557 Spur 364 W. on Saturday, April 18 on adult softball fields 3, 4 and 5 beginning at 9 a.m.**

## **PING PONG**

1. All games will be played under ITTF rules. Official rules will be given out at the coaches meeting on Tuesday, April 7 at the Harvey Hall in Hall 2, 2000 W Front St.
2. Games will be played at the **Glass Recreation Center, 501 w. 32nd St. on April 23, beginning at 6 p.m.**

## **TRIVIA**

1. Up to 5 players per team are allowed.
2. No yelling out answers, right or wrong. It disrupts the game and can bother other players.
3. No cell phones or any type of outside sources are allowed. Teams that are reported using any outside devices will be disqualified. Remember, it is LAME to cheat trivia.
4. Teams will sit together
5. Host will ask questions over the PA system
6. Each team has 15 seconds to answer the question after Host says go
7. For each right answer: The first team to answer correctly will get an additional point.
8. There will be an official score keeper with each team to keep track of score.
9. At the end, 1-3 are announced based on points.
10. Trivia will take place at the **Senior Center, 1915 Garden Valley Rd. on Tuesday, April 14 starting at 6 p.m.**

## **Bowling**

1. A team may consist of three players.
2. Two games, best scores out of the two. Before starting second game, score must be written down by official score keeper.
3. You are allowed to bring your own bowling bowls and shoes.
4. Bowling will take place at **Grand Slam, 5201 S Broadway Ave., on Monday, April 27 starting at 6 p.m.**

## **VOLLEYBALL**

1. A minimum of three men and three women will make up a team. You may have up to three substitute players on a team.
2. A max of three men can play on the court.
3. The 2017-2019 U.S. Volleyball rules will apply for co-ed.
4. Single elimination tournament will be offered.
5. To start and continue a game, a team must have three males and three females on the court. Serving in order and positions on the court must alternate in gender. When the ball is played more than once by a team, at least one of the contacts must be made by the female player. Substitutions can only be made in the center back position. The only exception to the rules is if a player is injured, a substitute of the same gender may enter at that player's position.
6. A match will consist of the best two out of three games. The first two games will be first to 20, tally scoring. If there is a third game will be the first to 15, tally scoring.
7. A new game will begin every 20 minutes.
8. All games will be played at the **Glass Recreation Center, 501 W. 32nd St., on April 20 & 22. Game times are set between 6 p.m. and 9:30 p.m.**
