

Nominations

The nomination form requires a narrative of up to two pages that describes the historical contribution of the nominee.

The nominee's contribution to the history of the community must have been made no fewer than 25 years ago.

Possible areas that nominees may have contributed to could include, but are not limited to, agriculture, architecture, arts/culture, aviation, business, community service, education, entertainment/media, industry, invention/innovation, law, medicine, oil/gas, philanthropy, religion, science, sports and transportation.

Nominations will be presented to the Historical Preservation Board for final consideration.
